Oregon Right to Life Rally

March for Life begins immediately after the Rally

Oregon Right to Life is hosting their annual Rally to commemorate the 43rd anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion throughout nine months of pregnancy. We will gather to honor the lives of the 58 million American unborn babies who have lost their lives to abortion. The Portland Praise Band will begin its life-celebrating concert at 2:15 pm.

This year's featured speaker is **Lila Rose**, pro-life activist and founder and president of Live Action, a new media non-profit dedicated to ending abortion and building a culture of life. Lila conducts undercover investigations of abortion facilities in the United States, including Planned Parenthood affiliates, and has unmasked some of America's most notorious abortion facilities. David Daleiden, who was instrumental in the videos exposing Planned Parenthood's marketing of aborted baby parts, works with Lila.

Live Action uses investigative journalism to expose the abortion industry's threats against the vulnerable and defenseless. The group oversees the largest pro-life social media platform on the web, including over one million Facebook fans and over 58,000 followers on Twitter. Lila is a regular guest on national television and radio programs. She was named among National Journal's "25 Most Influential Washington Women Under 35."

A special youth rally with Lila Rose will be held following the March for Life at the Urban Studio, 935 NW Davis, from 4:45 to 6:00 pm. Pizza and a band will be provided.

Apologética

(Es dar una Explicación Razonada de tu Fe)
(Parte 13)

La apologética cumple con la orden de San Pedro:
Véase (1 Pe 3:14-16).

Debemos siempre tener en cuenta los siguientes puntos:

El Camino de la Biblia

Los cristianos razonables se dan cuenta que si Dios se ha revelado al hombre, debemos poder conocer con seguridad dónde ésta revelación se puede encontrar. Dado que de la verdad de la palabra de Dios depende nuestra salvación, **tenemos que saber exacta e infaliblemente qué libros contienen la verdad divina.** De otro modo podríamos buscar en las palabras de los hombres la Palabra de Dios. Por lo tanto necesitamos una lista divinamente autorizada (canon) de los libros inspirados de la Biblia. "Canon" significa un patrón de medida. El **canon de la Escritura** se refiere a un patrón, o lista oficial de libros inspirados que componen la Biblia.

El Antiguo Testamento (AT)

¿Por qué las Biblias Católicas y Protestantes tienen en el Antiguo Testamento un número diferente de libros?

La traducción griega del AT fue la usada por Jesús y los escritores del Nuevo Testamento. La Iglesia siguió usando la traducción griega. Cuando la Iglesia oficialmente decidió cuales libros formaban oficialmente el canon de la Biblia en los Concilios de Hipona en el año 395 D.C. y Cartago, **aprobó los cuarenta y seis libros del canon alejandrino como canon del AT.** Por 16 siglos la validez de este canon fue materia de fe sin reto alguno. En 1529 Martin Lutero propuso un canon de treinta y nueve libros como el canon del AT. Lutero se sintió justificado para remover esos libros por la preocupación de los miembros del Concilio de Jasminia de que los libros griegos no tenían versiones en griego. Sin embargo las investigaciones conducidas sobre los Rollos del Pergamino del Mar Muerto encontrados en Qumram *han descubierto antiguas copias antiguas hebreas de algunos libros disputados.* Los libros son: **Sabiduría, Eclesiástico, Judit, Baruc, Tobías y el I y II de Macabeos.** La Biblia católica contiene todos los 46 libros.
