Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica
IV ¿Cómo Hablar con Dios?

42. Dios trasciende toda criatura. Es preciso pues, purificar sin cesar nuestro lenguaje de todo lo que tiene de limitado, de expresión por medio de imágenes, de imperfecto, para no confundir al Dios “que está por encima de todo nombre y más allá de todo entendimiento, el invisible y fuera de todo alcance” con nuestras representaciones humanas quedan siempre más acá del Misterio de Dios.

43. Al alabar así a Dios, nuestro lenguaje se expresa ciertamente de modo humano, pero capta realmente a Dios mismo, sin poder, no obstante, expresarlo en su infinita simplicidad. Es preciso recordar en efecto, que “entre el Creador y la criatura no se puede señalar una semejanza tal que la desemejanza entre ellos no sea mayor todavía”, y que nosotros no podemos captar a Dios lo que Él es, sino solamente los que no es como los otros seres que se sitúan con relación a Él”.

Nuestra parroquia hará la colecta para la Arquidiócesis Castrense de los Estados Unidos de América la próxima semana. La Arquidiócesis Castrense depende únicamente de benefactores privados para apoyar su misión de “servir aquellos que sirven” y su ministerio de proporcionar el mismo cuidado pastoral y servicios a los católicos en el servicio de las fuerzas armadas de los Estados Unidos, a los matriculados en las academias militares de los Estados Unidos, a los que están sometidos a tratamiento médico en cualquiera de los 153 Centros médicos del Departamento de los Veteranos, a los que trabajan en posiciones civiles con el gobierno federal fuera de las fronteras de los Estados Unidos y a las familias de éstos, tal como lo hacen otras diócesis católicas para sus fieles. Mientras que el gobierno paga los salarios y el plan de retiro de los capellanes castrenses católicos, la Arquidiócesis Castrense no recibe fondos del gobierno o de la militar para sufragar los gastos de los programas y servicios, incluso el Programa de Seminarista Copatrocinado, el cual proporciona sacerdotes para la diócesis de origen y la capellanía castrense.

El jueves, 17 de noviembre a las 7:00 pm, la organización local Más Allá de la Guerra ofrece una charla para explorar las ideas y las medidas prácticas que podemos tomar para ayudar a la humanidad a encontrar un camino hacia la paz mundial. Saint of the Month: St. Elizabeth Hesselblad ~ June 4, 1870 – April 24, 1957

“God gave me early on the grace to understand that difficulties are sent to be conquered. With God’s help, everything can be overcome, but, without His support, all effort is useless.” ~ St. Elizabeth

St. Elizabeth, one of our recently canonized saints, was a Swedish nurse and convert who has been accorded the title of “Righteous Among the Nations,” an honor given by Israel to the Gentiles who risked their lives to save Jews during the Holocaust. The tenth of thirteen children, she was baptized a Lutheran and at age 18 immigrated to the United States, where she studied nursing in order to help support her family. Shortly after her conversion to Catholicism, she returned to Europe, where she founded a renewed order of Bridgettine Sisters that focused on the care of the sick. She was dedicated to combating racism and was responsible for personally saving at least 60 Jews by hiding them at her motherhouse in Rome during World War II.
