FIRST COMMUNION GUIDELINES

If you are interested in having your child receive First Holy Communion, you will need to complete the following steps before your child can receive the sacrament. You must:

- Be registered and active members of the parish for at least 6 months.
- Public School and home school children need to be registered in faith formation for at least two years. O'Hara families, please call Julie in the Parish Office (541-342-1139).
- Your child must attend all required classes and activities.
- You must register for the sacrament with the Parish Office.

Plan ahead! If you have a first grader – please enroll them now to meet the two year requirement. Certain requirements can be waived depending on the circumstances but prior permission must be obtained. If you have an older child who needs sacraments or have any questions, please call Julie Rutledge Sanchez in the Parish Office.

Oregon Catholic Conference Statement

House Bill 3391 Forces Coverage of Abortion and Expands Taxpayer-Funded Abortion

The day after our country celebrated Independence Day, the Oregon State Legislature passed a bill that has more to do with force than it does with freedom. House Bill 3391 forces insurance companies to cover abortion on demand and it forces all Oregon taxpayers to help finance an extremist abortion agenda that does not enjoy majority support.

By insisting on complete insurance coverage of abortion, including late-term and sex-selective abortions, the legislature shows itself intolerant of widely-held opposing views and will compel thousands of Oregonians to support what their consciences reject.

The Oregon House Bill 3391 was signed into law on August 15, 2017, by Governor Kate Brown. The destructive and costly legislation was declared an “emergency” and goes into effect immediately.

Oregonians opposed to House Bill 3391 should lend their support to the stop taxpayer funding for abortion act. This measure needs 117,000 signatures to qualify as an initiative for the 2018 election.
