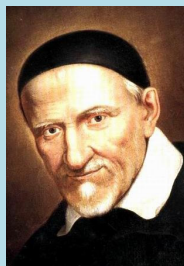

St. Vincent de Paul was born to a poor French family that lived near the river "Paul," hence his name "de Paul." He showed such promise as a student that his father sold the family ox to pay for him to go to the seminary. Not long after his ordination, he was captured by Barbary pirates as he traveled on business. He served as a slave to three masters; his final owner was a Christian who had renounced the Faith. Vincent reconverted him and was allowed to return to France. Known as the Great Apostle of Charity, he worked tirelessly for the poor but as a spiritual director was equally concerned with helping serve priests and seminarians. His feast day is **September 27**.

To the Parents of Our Young Children, May We Suggest...

Sit toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what's going on at the altar. They tire of seeing the back of others' heads.

Quietly explain the parts of the Mass and actions of the priest, deacon, altar servers, choir, etc.

Sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.

If you have to leave Mass with your child, feel free to do so. But please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."

Remember that the way we welcome children in the church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship.
