SCRIPTURE 1

John 3:16-17

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.

SCRIPTURE 2

Hebrews 10:21-24

Since we have "a great priest over the house of God," let us approach with a sincere heart and in absolute trust, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water. Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy. We must consider how to rouse one another to love and good works.

Question 1

What in the church fills me with life? How is the Holy Spirit working in my life to deepen my faith and inspire me to be a better disciple and witness of Christ's love to others?

Question 2

As a community of believers, what experiences of the Catholic Church have brought joys or revealed wounds? And how can these experiences help us grow together in faith and offer the hope and healing of Christ to the greater community in which we live?

SCRIPTURE 3

1 John 1:1-4

For God so loved the world that he Beloved: What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of life — for the life was made visible; we have seen it and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was made visible to us— what we have seen and heard we proclaim now to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; for our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. We are writing this so that our joy may be complete.

Question 3

As a Catholic community, we are expressly enjoined to invite others into a life-giving relationship with Jesus Christ. When we dream about how best to accomplish this, what steps is the Holy Spirit inviting the Church in western Oregon to take?

Table Conversations

Immediately following the Holy Hour/prayer time, gather as a large group.

Break into small groups for listening, discussing & discerning.

The small group will choose a table leader and scribe (unless a table leader has been designated ahead of time)

- Table conversations focus on the three questions.
- Identify common themes to report out to the large group.
- Gather as a large group to report highlights of small group table conversations.
- Conclude with prayer.

Following the discernment sessions, parish representatives will prayerfully review and submit the results of the discernment session to the synod coordinator, who will ensure the report is submitted through an Archdiocesan online portal by March 31, 2022.

Parish representatives will later gather during vicariate (regional) discernment sessions to report what was heard in the parish and help identify common themes and steps the Holy Spirit might be inviting the Church to take.
