## (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC: A PROPHET'S REWARD

"Move back in with us until you save enough for a decent house," my mother told me over and over again as the birth of my second child neared.

My little family was quickly outgrowing our rented space, but the housing market in our area was a nightmare for first-time homebuyers. As appealing as the offer was, I kept refusing, convinced that my mother didn't understand the chaos, disruption, and loss of personal space that such a move would mean for her and my dad.

I was wrong — she did. And eventually she wore me down. When my son was three months old my family of four moved back into my old bedroom. My parents made an office space for my husband in the basement, and they converted their den into a playroom for two of the loudest children you will ever meet. They told us we could stay as long as we needed to (it ended up being two years). They greeted us with love and warmth every morning and never made us feel like we were an inconvenience.

Today's first reading always reminds me of my mom, not because I consider myself a prophet (hardly) but because of the way she received me — specifically, in whose name she received me.

I've always tried to understand exactly what makes my parents' acts of love — toward me, toward each other, toward perfect strangers — feel so genuine. I think, after more than 30 years, I've finally realized the secret: my parents love God more than they love me. They love God more than they love anyone.

Like making room in their life and their home for me and my boisterous family, these acts originate in sacrifice. They don't come cheap. They come from the cross.

"Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." — Matthew 10:39



## EUCCHARISTIC RENEWAL

When you hear the bells ring during Mass, pay attention! The bells are saying, "Look! Look! This is important!" Jesus is about to be made present on the altar.

Listen for the words of consecration at Mass:

"TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT,  
FOR THIS IS MY BODY,  
WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU."

&

"TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT,  
FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD,  
THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL  
COVENANT."

Something special is going on in our country right now. The entire United States is in the midst of a three-year Eucharistic Revival. Think of the long-term impact! What a beautiful time in our Catholic Church for all its members — the oldest all the way to our youngest. Personally, I am excited by the many possibilities to help our nation's children love our Eucharistic Lord more deeply.

Our job is to find ways to plant the knowledge seeds of Jesus' True Presence deep within our children's hearts. By teaching and finding different ways of reinforcing the core truth of our Catholic faith, we are laying the foundation — a strong foundation for our students to live Eucharistic lives and a lasting faith in something their five senses cannot detect. With this truth, we build a love for visiting Jesus upon the "source and summit" of our faith. We help prepare our students for the amazingsness of being in the physical presence of Jesus at Mass and in Adoration.

Practically when involving children in Revival efforts, start with these basics — "What is the Eucharist?," "Why is the Eucharist so important?," and "What is the Eucharistic Revival?" It is important to teach our children the special language of our Catholic faith. Yet, we need to supplement this faith language with age-appropriate words and explanations. In addition, using imagery and relatable examples will help forge strong connections for children with our Eucharistic King. Envision the future of our Church, of our nation, as we actively involve children in the Revival in our corner of God's kingdom.

## (PRACTICANDO) CATÓLICA: LA RECOMPENSA DE UN PROFETA

“Vuelve a vivir con nosotros hasta que ahorres lo suficiente para una casa decente,” me decía mi madre una y otra vez a medida que se acercaba el nacimiento de mi segundo hijo. Mi pequeña familia estaba superando rápidamente nuestro espacio alquilado, pero el mercado inmobiliario en nuestra área era una pesadilla para los compradores de vivienda por primera vez. A pesar de lo atractiva que era la oferta, seguí negándome, convencida de que mi madre no entendía el caos, la interrupción y la pérdida de espacio personal que significaría tal movimiento para ella y mi padre.

Yo estaba equivocada, si lo sabía. Y eventualmente ella me desgastó. Cuando mi hijo tenía tres meses, mi familia de cuatro se mudó a mi antiguo dormitorio. Mis padres hicieron un espacio de oficina para mi esposo en el sótano y convirtieron su estudio en una sala de juegos para dos de los niños más ruidosos que jamás hayas conocido. Nos dijeron que podíamos quedarnos todo el tiempo que necesitáramos (al final fueron dos años). Nos saludaron con amor y calidez todas las mañanas y nunca nos hicieron sentir como si fuéramos un inconveniente.

La primera lectura de hoy siempre me recuerda a mi mamá, no porque me considere un profeta (difícilmente) sino por la forma en que me recibió, específicamente, en nombre de quién me recibió.

Siempre he tratado de entender exactamente qué hace que los actos de amor de mis padres (hacia mí, el uno hacia el otro, hacia perfectos extraños) se sientan tan genuinos. Creo que, después de más de 30 años, finalmente me di cuenta del secreto: mis padres aman a Dios más de lo que me aman a mí. Aman a Dios más de lo que aman a nadie.

Como hacer espacio en su vida y en su hogar para mí y mi bulliciosa familia, estos actos se originan en el sacrificio. No son baratos. Vienen de la cruz.
