(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC: WE BEAR THE NAME OF THE LORD

The name of the Lord is a curiously powerful thing. Say it deliberately, even in a group of people who are not particularly religious, and you'll know what I mean. There is a shift in the mood, a change in the atmosphere. When we utter the name of the Lord, He turns His head.

Once, in confession, I admitted to the sin of using the Lord's name in vain. "When you do that, tell God that you love him," advised the priest, who was wise enough to know that I would repeat this sin at some point. "You've said His name, after all. You have His attention." We hear the name of the Lord, and we think of what it represents — John 3:16, salvation history summed up in a neat little sentence, the why and the how and the who of it all laid out before us. The Lord, so slow to anger that He offers us a million chances. The Lord, so rich in kindness and fidelity that He literally gave Himself to us that we might be saved.

But the name of the Lord is more than that. It is not just a symbol, it is an invitation. I think of Moses clutching the commandments, beseeching the Lord: "Come with us. Forgive us. Receive us as your own." The Lord accompanies us down the mountain. We bear the name of the Lord into the world with us wherever we go.

I have to ask myself: do I do that name justice?

"Blessed is your holy and glorious name, praiseworthy and exalted above all for all ages." — Daniel 3:52

EUCCHARISTIC RENEWAL

5 POINTS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST: PARTS 2 & 3

2. Observe the 1 hour eucharistic fast

This is a requirement...

Can 919: One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion.

This doesn't apply to those who are sick or elderly.

It's great to know the requirements, but why does the Church require us to do this?

There are two main reasons.

First, mortification is good and helps us grow in spiritual discipline. Second, the physical hunger we feel should remind us of the hunger and thirst we should have for the Eucharist.

And really, one hour isn't that long, the fast used to begin the midnight preceding receiving the Eucharist.

3. Arrive at Mass a few minutes early

Attending Mass and receiving Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is the most significant thing we could ever do. If you were going to an important dinner, say with diplomats or bishops, would you just walk right in, seat yourself at the dinner table, and start eating? Probably not.

You would get dressed and ready, arrive early to speak with people, seat yourself when called to dinner, and follow the "protocol" for such an event. There is a certain sense of preparation.

If we put this much attention into a formal dinner, how much more should we prepare for the eternal wedding banquet? Take a few minutes before Mass to prepare your heart to receive Christ, pray, and be intentional.

El nombre del Señor es algo curiosamente poderoso. Dilo deliberadamente, incluso en un grupo de personas que no son particularmente religiosas, y sabrás a lo que me refiero. Hay un cambio en el estado de ánimo, un cambio en la atmósfera. Cuando pronunciamos el nombre del Señor, Él voltea Su cabeza.

Una vez, en confesión, admití el pecado de usar el nombre del Señor en vano. "Cuando hagas eso, dile a Dios que lo amas," aconsejó el sacerdote, quien fue lo suficientemente sabio como para saber que en algún momento repetiría este pecado.
