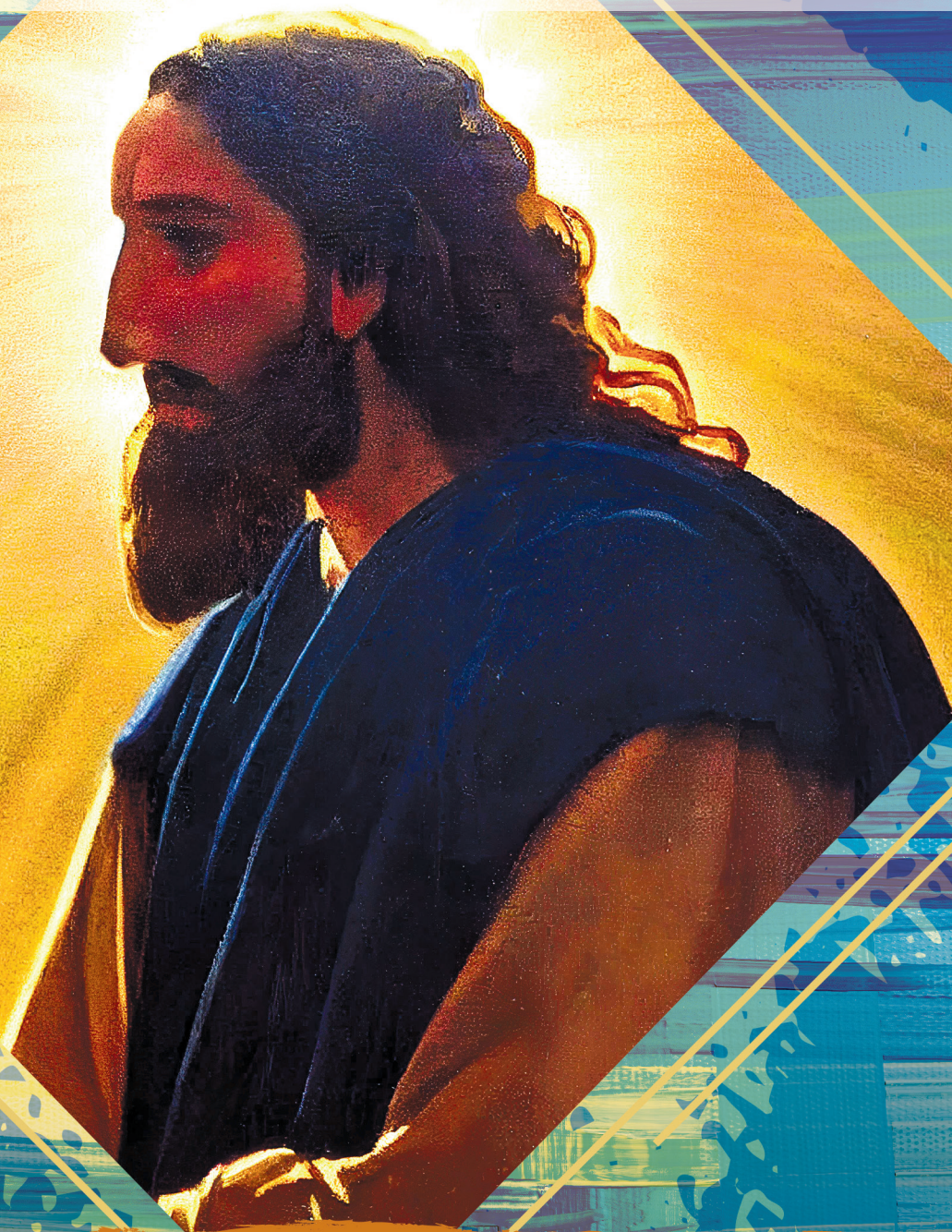

## (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC: THE NECKLACE

I have a necklace that originally belonged to my great-grandmother. I don't really know much about the man who gave it to her, most of those details have been lost to time. But I know that he wanted to marry her, and that she refused, and it had something to do with religion – ultimately, he did not share her faith. And while I've certainly seen many interfaith couples have loving and successful marriages, in this particular case, my great-grandmother discerned that this would not be one of those marriages.

Like I said, I don't have many details about this man, but I know that she felt she couldn't marry him because it might jeopardize the souls of her children, and therefore the souls of their children, and their children after them – me. She turned him down because of me.

My great-grandmother never sold that necklace, not even when the Great Depression further reduced her financial circumstances. She kept it, and she gave it to her daughter, who gave it to her daughter, who gave it to me. The necklace is always given with a warning: there is something worse than being poor, worse than being scared, worse even than being desperate. Worse than all of these things is separation from God.

When I wear this necklace, I think about my grandmother and this man she possibly loved a hundred years ago. I think of the many decisions we make every day – large and small, good and bad – that reverberate down through the generations in ways we cannot, at the time, imagine. I think of the God who knows every hair on my head.

## EUCCHARISTIC RENEWAL

### 5 POINTS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST: PARTS 4 & 5

#### 4. Make an act of reverence before receiving the Eucharist

You are going to receive the body, blood, soul, and divinity of the King of the universe, how could you possibly show the respect and reverence due in this moment?

Honestly, we can probably never show the amount of respect that our Savior deserves, but we can do what we can!

How? This can be done by genuflecting or making a deep bow before receiving the Eucharist. In this reverential act, we acknowledge who we are before God and humble ourselves to receive Him.

#### 5. Make a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass

Let's return to the fancy dinner scenario (remember the bishops and diplomats). Once you have finished eating, would you get up and walk out of the room? No! Especially if other people were still eating dinner and there was more to come.

After we receive Communion, we are the most united with Jesus we can be on this side of heaven.

This is our chance to open our hearts to Him without reserve. To pour out our love, and ask for whatever grace we need.

By staying a few minutes after Mass we are telling Jesus that He is important to us, that our relationship with Him matters and warrants our love and attention.

So, back to the opening click-bait question: Receive Jesus on your tongue or in your hands?

Both are allowed by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

When receiving in your hand, St. Cyril of Jerusalem offers some further instruction: “When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost.”

Tengo un collar que originalmente perteneció a mi bisabuela. Realmente no sé mucho sobre el hombre que se lo dio, la mayoría de esos detalles se han perdido en el tiempo. Pero sé que él quería casarse con ella, y ella se negó, y tenía algo que ver con la religión; en última instancia, él no compartía su fe. Y aunque ciertamente he visto a muchas parejas interreligiosas tener matrimonios amorosos y exitosos, en este caso particular, mi bisabuela discernió que este no sería uno de esos matrimonios.

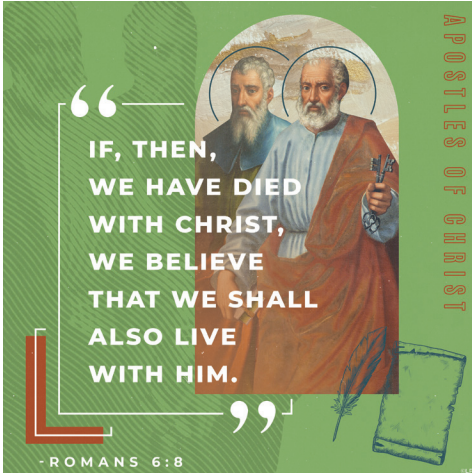
Como dije, no tengo muchos detalles sobre este hombre, pero sé que ella sintió que no podía casarse con él porque podría poner en peligro las almas de sus hijos y, por lo tanto, las almas de sus hijos y sus hijos después de ellos – a mí. Ella lo rechazó por mí.

Mi bisabuela nunca vendió ese collar, ni siquiera cuando la Gran Depresión redujo aún más su situación económica. Ella lo guardó y se lo dio a su hija, que se lo dio a su hija, que me lo dio a mí. El collar siempre se entrega con una advertencia: hay algo peor que ser pobre, peor que tener miedo, peor incluso que estar desesperado. Peor que todas estas cosas es la separación de Dios.

Cuando uso este collar, pienso en mi bisabuela y en este hombre al que posiblemente amo hace cien años. Pienso en las muchas decisiones que tomamos todos los días, grandes y pequeñas, buenas y malas, que repercuten a través de las generaciones en formas que, en ese momento, no podemos imaginar. Pienso en el Dios que conoce cada cabello de mi cabeza.
