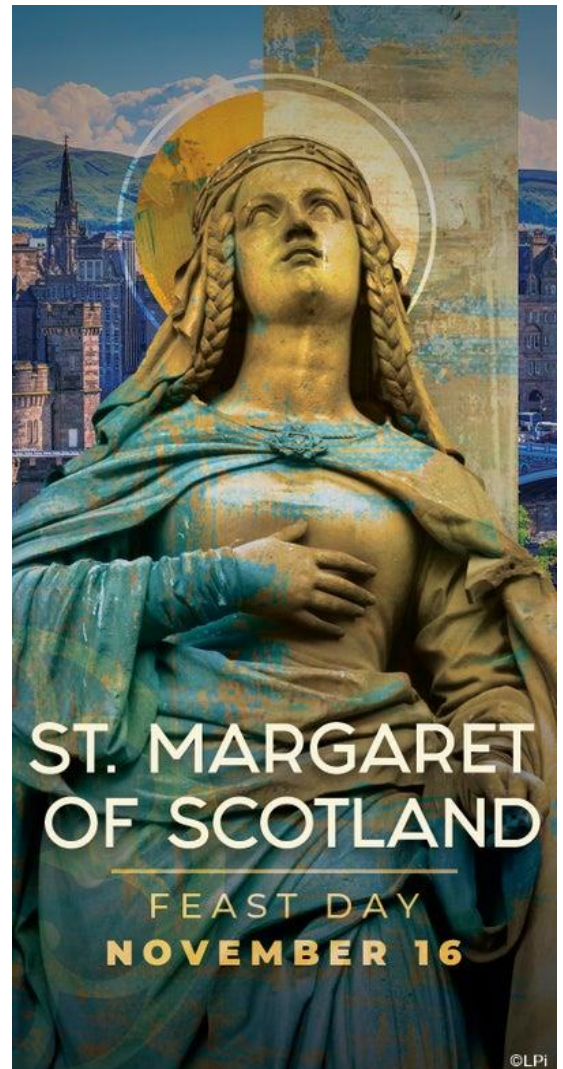

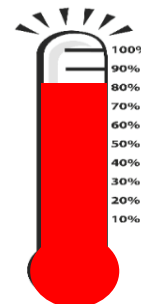

Seeking Wisdom

I think if any of us were asked the question, "Do you love wisdom? Do you seek wisdom?" we would, at first, be a little taken aback. And then we would answer quickly "Of course!" with absolutely no doubt in our minds.

But a different way of asking the question is this: "Are you making wise choices?" That's a question that would put a fair few of us on the back foot. The virgins who went out to meet the bridegroom were all the same. They had the exact same intentions. They had the exact same stamina, or lack of it. They had the exact same knowledge of the night being dark and lamps being necessary.

What made five foolish, and five wise?

It was their choices. Only their choices set them apart.

We may rely upon the wisdom of another — the parent who reminds us to go to confession, the friend who demurs when we start speaking gossip, the priest who preaches boldly from the pulpit against an injustice we lack the courage to denounce ourselves. But even if we feel safeguarded by their good influence, their wisdom won't save us.

We may possess a little wisdom ourselves — we may know well that a dark night is hard to navigate, and that we need the assistance of a lamp. We may go to Mass once in a while, read the Bible when we have time and serve others when it's convenient.

But a lamp needs oil to burn in the darkness, just as wisdom requires action to be brought forth into the world.

We may love God just as much as we should — our flesh may pine, our soul may thirst. But a parched field never brought rain on itself just by being dry.

We must make the choice.

Buscando Sabiduría

Creo que si a alguno de nosotros se nos hiciera la pregunta: "¿Amas la sabiduría? ¿Buscas sabiduría?" Al principio, estaríamos un poco desconcertados. Y luego respondíamos rápidamente "¡Por supuesto!" sin ninguna duda en nuestras mentes.

Pero una forma diferente de hacer la pregunta es esta: "¿Estás tomando decisiones sabias?" Esa es una pregunta que pondría a algunos de nosotros en la retaguardia.

Las vírgenes que salieron al encuentro del novio eran todas iguales. Tenían exactamente las mismas intenciones. Tenían exactamente la misma resistencia, o falta de ella. Tenían exactamente el mismo conocimiento de que la noche era oscura y que las lámparas eran necesarias.

¿Qué hizo cinco descuidadas y cinco provisoras?

Fueron sus elecciones. Solo sus elecciones las distinguen.

Podemos confiar en la sabiduría de otro: el padre o madre que nos recuerda ir a confesarnos, el amigo que pone objeciones cuando comenzamos a hablar chismes, el sacerdote que predica con audacia desde el púlpito contra una injusticia que no tenemos la valentía de denunciar. Pero incluso si nos sentimos protegidos por su buena influencia, su sabiduría no nos salvará.

Es posible que nosotros mismos poseamos un poco de sabiduría: podemos saber bien que una noche oscura es difícil de navegar y que necesitamos la ayuda de una lámpara. Podemos ir a Misa de vez en cuando, leer la Biblia cuando tenemos tiempo y servir a los demás cuando sea conveniente.

Pero una lámpara necesita aceite para arder en la oscuridad, así como la sabiduría requiere acción para manifestarse en el mundo.

Podemos amar a Dios tanto como deberíamos: nuestra carne puede sufrir, nuestra alma puede tener sed. Pero un campo reseco nunca trajo lluvia sobre sí mismo simplemente por estar seco.

Debemos hacer la elección.
