What would Mary do?

This Easter morning, I am thinking of Mary Magdalene.

I want to know her state of mind as she approached the tomb in the darkness. Was she afraid? Was she thinking clearly? Was she tired? Had grief and trauma robbed her of her sleep the last two nights? What did she intend to do? Anoint Christ's body, yes — but what else? Kiss his hands, trace the markings where the lash had fallen upon his skin? Say goodbye? Weep? Despair?

What were the words she planned to whisper into the cold, empty darkness that morning, as she wept over God's body?

I don't know anything about her state of mind that Easter morning, except that I know she wanted to be with Christ. Perhaps that was all she knew, too. Perhaps she had no other thought, no other desire, than nearness to him. She didn't need to understand everything, and she didn't expect answers — she didn't dare hope for that.

But everything and everyone had fallen apart around her, and in Jesus' presence she knew her heart would be able to rest.

If you have ever been in the midst of a crisis in your life and found yourself pacing the floors of your house when no one else is awake, muttering the words to a prayer you know by heart, you know what Mary Magdalene felt. In those moments, we do not always feel God's presence. Sometimes, when we look for Him, we only see an empty tomb.

When these dark moments come, I pray you will remember the faithfulness of this great saint. Be like Mary Magdalene. Look for Jesus, always. You may not always find him, but he will always find you.

CATHOLIC Q & A: DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come."

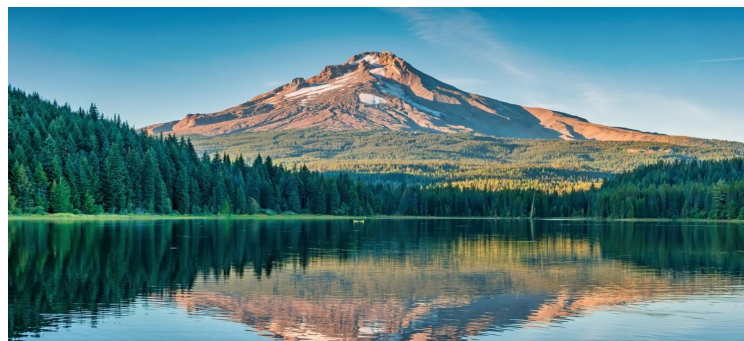

PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE TOUR 2024

The Immaculate Heart of Our Lady of Fatima statue was designed as she appeared in 1929 to Sr. Lucia in Tuy, Spain. It was during this apparition that Our Lady asked for the consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart. This statue was blessed by Pope Francis on October 23, 2013, 10 days after his consecration of the world to Our Lady of Fatima on October 13th. It was formally introduced at the 2014 March for Life in Washington, D. C., and was present soon after in Oregon at the consecration of the Archdiocese of Portland on June 28, 2014, by Archbishop Alexander Sample.

PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS CATÓLICAS: DOMINGO DE LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA

¿De dónde surgió la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia?

Si naciste mucho antes del año 2000, sabrás que la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia no siempre se ha celebrado en la Iglesia. A principios del siglo XX, una joven monja polaca comenzó a recibir revelaciones privadas. Jesús se le apareció durante sus momentos de oración, hablándole un mensaje de misericordia y amor para el mundo. Recibió una serie de oraciones, la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia, y la solicitud de establecer un día festivo para recordar a la Iglesia la misericordia de Dios. Santa Faustina murió en 1938, en el umbral de la guerra y en medio de uno de los siglos más violentos de la historia del mundo.

Su historia y sus diarios comenzaron a circular en Polonia y más allá. Rápidamente se hizo evidente que se trataba de una joven santa y se abrió la causa para su canonización. En el año 2000, fue canonizada por el primer Papa polaco, San Juan Pablo II. El día de su canonización, estableció el segundo domingo de Pascua como Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, "una invitación perenne al mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y pruebas que la humanidad experimentará en los años venideros".

TOUR A LA ESTATUA DE LA VIRGEN PEREGRINA

La estatua del Inmaculado Corazón de Nuestra Señora de Fátima fue diseñada tal como se apareció en 1929 a Sor Lucía en Tuy, España. Fue durante esta aparición que Nuestra Señora pidió la consagración de Rusia a su Inmaculado Corazón. Esta estatua fue bendecida por el Papa Francisco el 23 de octubre de 2013, 10 días después de su consagración del mundo a Nuestra Señora de Fátima el 13 de octubre. Se presentó formalmente en la Marcha por la Vida de 2014 en Washington, D. C., y estuvo presente poco después en Oregon en la consagración de la Arquidiócesis de Portland el 28 de junio de 2014 por el Arzobispo Alexander Sample.

Guardé la fecha para el **sábado 4 y domingo 5 de mayo**, cuando la estatua del Inmaculado Corazón de Nuestra Señora de Fátima estará en la Iglesia de Santa María. Próximamente se anunciará un calendario completo de eventos. Patrocinado por el Apostolado Mundial de Fátima, División de la Arquidiócesis de Portland.
