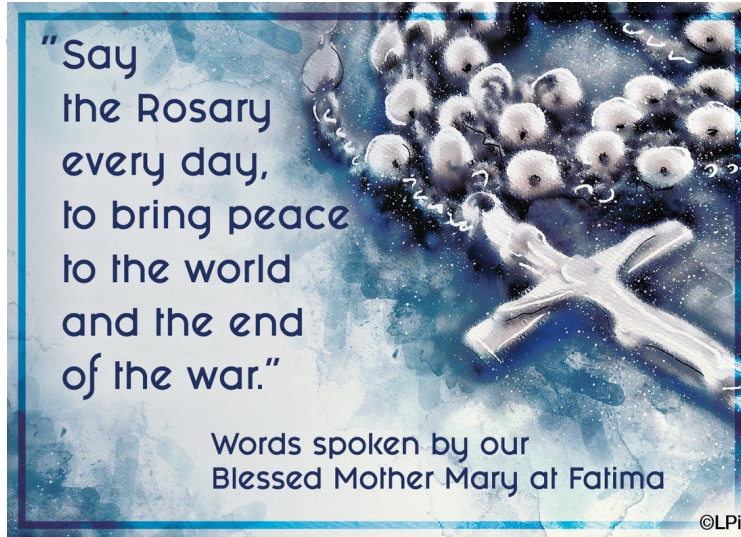

## PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE TOUR 2024

After being blessed by the Bishop of Leiria-Fatima, on October 13, 1947, the statue left Fatima and was flown to America to begin its tours. The bishop prayed that Our Lady's presence would travel with it wherever she went. It was blessed again in 1952 by Pope Pius XII, who crowned the original statue in Fatima as Queen of the World a few years earlier. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has visited over 100 countries, including Russia and China, bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions.

The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has been traveling for over 75 years and will be at St. Mary on **Saturday, May 4, and Sunday, May 5**. A full schedule of events is included on today's bulletin insert. The World Apostolate of Fatima, Portland Archdiocese Division is sponsoring this event.

## DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

### Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929

Father Edwin O'Hara was born and raised on a farm in Minnesota and he never forgot his farm background. After attending St. Paul's Seminary in Minnesota, he was ordained for the Archdiocese of Oregon City in 1905, where his Brother John, editor of the Catholic Sentinel and his close friend, Reverend George Thompson, had preceded him. Although a rather shy, quiet, gentle man, he was also a man of action. He soon became involved in the passage and enforcement of Oregon's minimum wage law in 1913, the first such law in the United States to be successful. After a short term as a chaplain in World War 1, he was asked to make a study of Catholic Education in rural areas for the National Catholic Education Association. From this he concluded that, "The primary product of the farm is not wheat or potatoes or cattle, it is people" and that the future of the Catholic Church in America lay in providing not only religious, but cultural, social and material advantages to make country living attractive. Impressed by his ideas, the Social Action Department of the National Catholic Welfare Council appointed him director of a Rural Life Bureau for research and education on Catholic rural life. Wanting a live laboratory for his ideas but realizing the shortage of priests in the Archdiocese of Oregon City, he asked to be changed from the Cathedral Parish in Portland to a rural parish. So it was that Father O'Hara was appointed to St. Mary Parish and came here on June 1, 1920.

The Eugene parish was a very fitting place at that time for Father O'Hara's projects, The city, which had a population of about 10,000, was in the middle of a large rural area. About half of the families belonging to the parish were farmers. The missions of the parish – Cottage Grove, Springfield, Junction City – and smaller communities in the surrounding foothills were either farming or lumbering communities. Catholic families were scattered over a wide area, from the Cascades to the Pacific, that formed St. Mary's parish at the time.

## TOUR A LA ESTATUA DE LA VIRGEN PEREGRINA

Después de ser bendecida por el obispo de Leiria-Fátima, el 13 de octubre de 1947, la estatua salió de Fátima y fue trasladada en avión a América para comenzar sus giras. El obispo oró para que la presencia de Nuestra Señora viajara con ella dondequiera que ella fuera. Fue bendecida nuevamente en 1952 por el Papa Pío XII, quien unos años antes coronó la estatua original en Fátima como Reina del Mundo. La Estatua de la Virgen Peregrina Internacional ha visitado más de 100 países, incluidos Rusia y China, llevando el poderoso mensaje de salvación y esperanza de María a millones de personas.

La mundialmente famosa Estatua de la Virgen Peregrina Internacional ha estado viajando durante más de 75 años y estará en St. Mary el **sábado 4 y domingo 5 de mayo**. ## ¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

**Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929**

El padre Edwin O'Hara nació y creció en una granja en Minnesota y nunca olvidó sus antecedentes agrícolas. Después de asistir al Seminario St. Paul en Minnesota, fue ordenado sacerdote para la Arquidiócesis de la ciudad de Oregon en 1905, donde lo había precedido su hermano John, editor del "Catholic Sentinel" y su amigo cercano, el reverendo George Thompson. Aunque era un hombre bastante tímido, tranquilo y amable, también era un hombre de acción. Pronto se involucró en la aprobación y aplicación de la ley de salario mínimo de Oregon en 1913, la primera ley de este tipo en los Estados Unidos que tuvo éxito. Después de un breve período como capellán en la Primera Guerra Mundial, se le pidió que realizara un estudio sobre la educación católica en las zonas rurales para la Asociación Nacional de Educación Católica. A partir de esto concluyó que "el producto principal de la granja no es el trigo, ni las patatas, ni el ganado, sino las personas" y que el futuro de la Iglesia Católica en América radica en proporcionar ventajas no sólo religiosas, sino culturales, sociales y materiales. Hacer atractiva la vida en el campo. Impresionado por sus ideas, el Departamento de Acción Social del Consejo Nacional Católico de Bienestar lo nombró director de una Oficina de Vida Rural para la investigación y la educación sobre la vida rural católica. Queriendo un laboratorio vivo para sus ideas pero al darse cuenta de la escasez de sacerdotes en la Arquidiócesis de la ciudad de Oregon, pidió que lo cambiaran de la Parroquia Catedral en Portland a una parroquia rural. Así fue que el Padre O'Hara fue designado para la parroquia de St. Mary y vino aquí el 1 de junio de 1920.

La parroquia de Eugene era un lugar muy apropiado en ese momento para los proyectos del Padre O'Hara. La ciudad, que tenía una población de alrededor de 10.000 habitantes, estaba en medio de una gran zona rural. Aproximadamente la mitad de las familias que pertenecían a la parroquia eran agricultores. Las misiones de la parroquia - Cottage Grove, Springfield, Junction City - y las comunidades más pequeñas en las estribaciones circundantes eran comunidades agrícolas o madereras. Las familias católicas estaban dispersas en la amplia zona desde Cascades hasta el Pacífico que formaba la parroquia de St. Mary en ese momento. Continuará.
