CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Age appropriate lessons based on the day's Gospel readings are offered during the 10:00 am Mass for children kindergarten to third grade, during the school year. No registration is required.

PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE TOUR 2024

The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has been traveling for over 75 years and will be at St. Mary on **Saturday, May 4, and Sunday, May 5**. A full schedule of events is included on today's bulletin insert. The World Apostolate of Fatima, Portland Archdiocese Division is sponsoring this event.

After being blessed by the Bishop of Leiria-Fatima, on October 13, 1947, the statue left Fatima and was flown to America to begin its tours. The bishop prayed that Our Lady's presence would travel with it wherever she went. It was blessed again in 1952 by Pope Pius XII, who crowned the original statue in Fatima as Queen of the World a few years earlier. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has visited more than 100 countries, including Russia and China, bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929

Among Father O'Hara's first projects was to move the church and school from Willamette Street to property purchased in 1909 at the northeast corner of 11th and Lincoln. Starting on August 12, 1920, it took approximately two weeks to move the church. Father O'Hara directed the moving himself. Masses for the Feast of the Assumption on August 15, and for the next Sunday were offered beneath the trees on the northeast corner of 10th and Lincoln. On Sunday, August 29, it was possible to have services in the church even though it was still up on rollers. According to memories, it was a jubilant occasion.

Only part of the school, built in Father O'Farrell's time, was moved to the new location. The school was set behind the church facing Lincoln Street and a new section was built in front of it, including space for the high school, rooms for music, and a meeting hall upstairs.

In its new location the school continued to grow. The enrollment, which was 105 in September of 1920, reached 137 by the end of the scholastic year. Each year saw a steady increase in students. The State Superintendent of Schools, J. A. Churchill, visited the school in 1921. He was pleased with the work being done and St. Mary's School was accepted as a "standard school" by the state of Oregon in 1922. That first year, at the commencement exercises for the high school, seven girls graduated. Four of them became Sisters of the Holy Names:

- Catherine Flynn (Sister Miriam Evelyn)
- Catherine Gallagher (Sister M. Grace Veronica)
- Isabelle Goheen (Sister Veronica Mary)
- Dorothy Schmitz (Sister Genevieve Mary).

The other three were Theresa Hoffman, Elsie Houck, and Maria Kinney. To be continued.

¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929

Uno de los primeros proyectos del padre O'Hara fue trasladar la iglesia y la escuela de Willamette Street a una propiedad comprada en 1909 en la esquina noreste de 11th y Lincoln. A partir del 12 de agosto de 1920, se necesitaron aproximadamente dos semanas para trasladar la iglesia. El padre O'Hara dirigió él mismo la mudanza. Se ofrecieron misas para la Fiesta de la Asunción el 15 de agosto y para el domingo siguiente debajo de los árboles en la esquina noreste de 10th y Lincoln. El domingo 29 de agosto fue posible celebrar servicios religiosos en la iglesia a pesar de que todavía estaba sobre ruedas. Según los recuerdos, fue una ocasión de júbilo.

Sólo una parte de la escuela, construida en tiempos del padre O'Farrell, fue trasladada a la nueva ubicación. La escuela se ubicó detrás de la iglesia frente a Lincoln Street y se construyó una nueva sección frente a ella, que incluye espacio para la escuela secundaria, salas para música y una sala de reuniones en el piso de arriba.

En su nueva ubicación la escuela siguió creciendo. La matrícula, que era de 105 en septiembre de 1920, llegó a 137 al finalizar el año escolar. Cada año se produjo un aumento constante de estudiantes. El Superintendente de Escuelas del Estado, J. A. Churchill, visitó la escuela en 1921. Quedó satisfecho con el trabajo que se estaba realizando y la Escuela St. Mary's fue aceptada como una "escuela estándar" por el estado de Oregon en 1922. Ese primer año, en el Ejercicios de graduación de la escuela secundaria Se graduaron siete niñas. Cuatro de ellas se convirtieron en Hermanas de los Santos Nombres:

- Catherine Flynn (Hermana Miriam Evelyn)
- Catherine Gallagher (Hermana M. Grace Verónica)
- Isabelle Goheen (Hermana Verónica María)
- Dorothy Schmitz (Hermana Genevieve Mary).

Las otras tres eran Theresa Hoffman, Elsie Houck y Maria Kinney. Continuará.
