DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929

The students at the University of Oregon were another concern for Father O'Hara. As was true in many universities, and is still true, some professors were agnostic and the prevailing atmosphere was not conducive to supporting the student's religious convictions. Almost as soon as he arrived in Eugene, Father O'Hara began reorganizing the Newman Club. In 1921, the former Phi Delta Theta fraternity house on 13th and Kincaid was purchased and became the Newman Association Center. The three-story building provided rooms for lectures and socials, a library on the first floor, and living quarters for about 30 women students on the second and third floors. This building remained at the center of Newman Club activities until it was traded in 1923 for the house at 1062 Charnelton Street. This house retained the Newman Club sign even after it became the rectory.

With the purchase of more property in the block bounded by 10th and 11th Streets and Charnelton and Lincoln, Father O'Hara began concentrating everything there. He moved into the house at 1062 Charnelton Street which he shared with the Newman Club. In 1925 the Sisters of the Holy Names made their final move of these early years to 263 West 11th Street. Originally a onestory house, the roof was raised, and a second story was added to accommodate the Sister's needs. To be continued.




The photograph depicts the St. Mary Parish House and Newman Hall, as it appeared in 1923. The original house is still present and continues in use as offices and a rectory. In the early 1950s, a brick extension was added to the front of the house providing additional office space.

ST. DAMIAN OF MOLOKAI—MAY 10

St. Damien de Veuster of Molokai (1840–1889) cared for the physical, medical, and spiritual needs of those exiled to the leper colony on the Hawaiian island of Molokai. His life of service shed light on the effects of this devastating disease and allowed people to see those afflicted with it with more compassion and love.

This week my children were learning about energy. We set up an experiment with toy cars — one was placed in front of another, and a third was pushed into the two stationary ones.

The forward motion caused the front car to move, but not much. "Most of the energy goes into the car in the middle, not the car on the end," my daughter concluded.

I asked her why she seems to have so much energy, and I seem to have so little.

"Because you're old," she replied confidently.

Most days I feel like that first car, barreling at life with all my energy and love and good intentions, only to have it almost entirely absorbed by the proverbial middle car. It's so easy to be discouraged. The devil so badly wants us to feel discouraged.

But the law of love is not unlike the law of conservation of energy. Love is neither created nor destroyed. It is only transferred from one form to another. And yes, sometimes it certainly seems like it disappears. It appears to get lost between my hands and the plate of dinner that goes uneaten or evaporates off of my lips as words I fear are never heard. It is spat upon as a commandment the world would prefer I do not keep.

But we are not called to simply love one another - to love when it seems effective and productive and appreciated. We are called to love as Christ loved: recklessly, selflessly, and yes, even without logic. We are called to love with a love that doesn't give up and is never withdrawn. A love that doesn't fear death or the world's hatred. A love that stands willing to argue, to be reviled, to be dismissed.

We are called to be that first car, hurtling ourselves against a world that isn't ready to accept or understand us. And we trust that, even when we can't see how, the love that seems to disappear simply changes forms.

¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara 1920-1929

El padre O'Hara estaba iniciando su plan para llevar a Los estudiantes de la Universidad de Oregón eran otra preocupación para el padre O'Hara. Como sucedía y sigue siendo cierto en muchas universidades, algunos profesores eran agnósticos y la atmósfera reinante no era propicia para apoyar las convicciones religiosas de los estudiantes. Casi tan pronto como llegó a Eugene, el padre O'Hara comenzó a reorganizar el Newman Club. En 1921, se compró la antigua casa de la fraternidad Phi Delta Theta en 13th y Kincaid y se convirtió en el Centro de la Asociación Newman. El edificio de tres pisos ofrecía salas para conferencias y eventos sociales, una biblioteca en el primer piso y viviendas para unas 30 estudiantes en el segundo y tercer piso. Este edificio permaneció en el centro de las actividades del Newman Club hasta que fue cambiado en 1923 por la casa en 1062 Charnelton Street. Esta casa conservó el letrero del Newman Club incluso después de convertirse en rectoría.

Con la compra de más propiedades en el bloque delimitado por las calles 10 y 11 y Charnelton y Lincoln, el padre O'Hara comenzó a concentrar todo allí. Se mudó a la casa en 1062 Charnelton Street que compartía con el Newman Club. En 1925, las Hermanas de los Santos Nombres hicieron su último traslado de estos primeros años al 263 West 11th Street. Originalmente era una casa de un piso, se levantó el techo y se agregó un segundo piso para satisfacer las necesidades de la Hermana. Continuará.
